

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

- Go to <https://wcsahawaii.org> to sign up or come in person.
- A placement test must be done prior to registering in a class.
- Please bring a valid government-issued photo ID (State I.D., Driver's License, Passport or Military I.D.) and payment with you to registration. A Social Security number is also required for any HSE, WDDW, ABE and ELA courses.
- The administration reserves the right to combine or cancel any class which lacks sufficient enrollment. All fees will be collected at the time of registration.
- \$20.00 enrollment fee will not be charged this term.
- Books will be purchased by students at registration. **Cash only.** Book fees are non-refundable.
- Other fees may include those for supplemental materials (i.e. handouts) used in the class and a Lab Fee collected to maintain the equipment used.

CASAS PLACEMENT ASSESSMENT

All new or returning students must take an assessment test for all Adult Basic Education, Adult Secondary Education, and English Language Acquisition classes prior to registration. The assessment test will be used to determine which class best fits the student's academic needs. Students must register in person. Please bring a valid government-issued photo ID (State ID, Driver's License, Passport, or Military ID) to register and to take the assessment test.
