



LEARNER OUTCOMES

Effective communicator

The ability to communicate effectively through verbal, written, and/or non-verbal means

(e.g., actively listens to ideas/opinions of others; speaks/writes clearly to convey ideas/opinions; seeks information through reading and questioning)

Complex thinker and problem solver

The ability to demonstrate critical thinking and problem solving skills

(e.g., applies prior knowledge/experiences to new situations; considers multiple perspectives when analyzing/solving problems; thinks creatively to generate ideas/approaches to solving problems)

Independent and lifelong learner

The ability to be responsible for one's own learning

(e.g., sets goals and personal plans for learning; manages time; monitors progress toward achieving goals)

Prepared for the world of work

The ability to gain the knowledge, skills, and abilities needed for employment and/or job training

(e.g., uses technology effectively and ethically; possesses work skills such as situational judgment, active listening, problem solving, effective communication, and conflict resolution)

Motivated to do one's best in school

The ability to have the drive or a strong desire to do well or succeed in one's learning

(e.g., attends class regularly; participates in class and is actively engaged; completes assignments; asks for help to better understand something)
