DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION/SCHOOL POLICIES

- Enrollment is open to all persons 18 years and over, regardless of race, color, national origin, ancestry, sex, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, age, disability, and religion. Be prepared to present photo identification.
- Students ages 16-17 must be officially released from a public high school in the State of Hawaii before admission into academic classes. Call our office for more information.
- Unregistered persons, including children, are not allowed in adult classes.
- The consumption of alcohol, illegal substances and the use of tobacco products are prohibited during school functions and on school grounds.
- The school reserves the right to remove from class and school grounds any student or individual exhibiting inappropriate behavior.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

- All students will be required to create a Hawaii.gov online account before registering for classes.
- All students will be assessed a \$20 enrollment fee.
- Registration may be conducted in-person or online at our website www.wcsahawaii.org.
- If registering online, you will receive a call to schedule a placement test (if needed) and/or the class you will be placed in.
- Please bring a valid government-issued photo ID (State ID, Driver's License, Passport or Military ID) with you to on-site registration and testing. For online registration, bring your ID with you to your pre-test assessment session.
- A Social Security number is also required for any HSE, WDDP, ABE and ELA course.
- The administration reserves the right to combine or cancel any class which lacks sufficient enrollment.
- Books may be purchased by students at registration. Book fees are non-refundable.
- Refunds vary by the type of fees that are paid. Enrollment fees are NON-REFUNDABLE unless the school cancels the class. Tuition fees vary by course and may be refunded only if a request is made **before the start of the second class or the school cancels the class.** Testing fees are non-refundable. Refunds may take 6-8 weeks.

CASAS PLACEMENT TEST

All new or returning students (after one year of absence) must take a placement test prior to enrolling in any academic or community school diploma course. The placement test will be used to determine which class best fits the student's academic need. Please bring a valid picture ID with birth date (State ID, Driver's License, Passport, or Military ID) to the assessment test:

BLENDED ONLINE LEARNING (BL)

These classes allow you to work at home on your computer, at your own pace in addition to weekly online meetings with a teacher. You will have access seven days a week, 24/hours a day. Enroll with your campus. Upon registration you will receive a call and be placed in a class. You may also be scheduled for an online learning program orientation.

SPECIAL INTEREST CLASSES

Special Interest classes are offered as a service to the community fostering lifelong learning and enriching the quality of life on the Windward side of Oahu. There is a minimal charge for tuition and a minimum number of students needed to run these classes. Special Interest classes are supported by the fees collected. Student has the option to either purchase their own supplies or obtain it from the instructor. A list of the supplies will be provided.

PROGRAMS AND COURSES

HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY PREPARATION PROGRAM (HSE)

The High School Equivalency Program provides an opportunity for adults to earn a diploma through preparation courses for the GED® or HiSET® Tests. A textbook is available for purchase at each campus. The following requirements are needed to qualify for the diploma:

- A minimum test score must be met by either the GED® or HiSET® Tests:
 - **GED®**: A score of 145 out of 200 will be required on each of the 4 subtest (Reasoning through Language Arts, Mathematical Reasoning, Science and Social Studies).
 - **HiSET®**: A score of 8 out of 20 on 5 subtests (Language Arts – Reading, Language Arts –Writing, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies), 2 out of 6 on the essay and a minimum total score of 45 out of 100. **HiSET® Tests will no longer be administered in Hawaii after Dec. 31, 2021.**
- Minimum ½ credit from an accredited private/public high school in Hawaii or at one of the Hawaii Community Schools for Adults.
- An official transcript from an accredited Hawaii high or Adult Community school.
- If you are under 18 years of age, you will need to provide additional documentation before being approved to register for the test. Contact our school for more information.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT DIPLOMA PROGRAM (WDDP)

The Workforce Development Diploma Program provides an opportunity for adults to gain the knowledge, skills, and abilities needed for employment and/or job training. The Workforce Development Diploma is not a High School Equivalency.

Module 1: The Academic Section

Students work in two classes on reading and math. Classes also teach work skills (active listening and situational judgment). Students must also:

- attend at least 75% of the total class sessions,
- complete assigned tasks for each class,
- complete a total of 120 hours of combined on-site classes and computer-based learning, **AND**
- attain a minimum 5-point scale score gain or an Educational Functioning Level gain as measured on the CASAS/TABE pre- and post-tests.

Module 2: Career Goals

Students must complete and provide documentation for **one** of the following choices. The student must:

- be employed or volunteer for a minimum of 100 hours within a two- to six-month period of the start of the program (hours must be with the same organization); **OR**
- complete the iCAN Program requirements; **OR**
- complete a minimum of one credit at an accredited post-secondary institution.

ADULT BASIC EDUCATION (ABE)

A series of classes designed to help adults build on basic academic skills in reading, writing, and math. Skills learned in ABE classes will help prepare adults for the next step in earning a community school diploma.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ACQUISITION (ELA)

These classes focus on the development of communication skills in speaking, listening, reading, writing, and basic mathematics for foreign-born students. The ELA class also utilizes BurlingtonEnglish, a computer-based learning program.

The ParaPro Prep Course provides an opportunity for individuals to gain the knowledge, skills, and abilities needed to pass the ParaPro Assessment that is required for employment as a ParaProfessional in the Hawaii DOE. The ParaPro Assessment is a general aptitude test that is required in many states for paraprofessional certification.
